Special Assessment Projects

What is a Special Assessment Project?

A Special Assessment Project offers property owners within unincorporated Manatee County the opportunity to obtain new services or infrastructure. Examples include:

- Street Lighting
- Road Paving
- Sanitary Sewer Line Extensions
- Potable Water Line Extensions
- Reclaimed Water Line Extensions
- Stormwater Ditch Piping

These services are paid through non-ad valorem assessments levied **annually on the property taxes of the owners** within a Municipal Service Benefit Unit (MSBU) district that is established for the project.

What is a non-ad valorem assessment?

Assessments which are not based upon millage and which can become a lien against a property.

Special Assessment Project Process

- 1. Petition by at least
 67% of property owners
 showing interest in
 participating in a special
 assessment project.
- 2. County staff develops feasibility report, conceptual design, and project cost estimate and presents at public meeting.
- 3. Postcard poll sent to property owners seeking service benefit.
- 4. If the poll results in at least 67% of the owners in favor of the project a public hearing will be held to present the project to the Board.
- 5. If approved by the Board, the County will solicit and procure the design and construction of the project.
- 6. After the construction is complete, a second public hearing will be held to adopt the annual assessment to be levied against each benefiting property.

Special Assessments

- The Board has the sole discretion to approve (even without 67% support) or deny each special assessment project.
- All design and construction costs are repaid to the County by the benefiting property owners through the annual assessment.
- Levied assessment are collected pursuant to Florida Statutes 197.3632 - Uniform method for the levy, collection, and enforcement of non-ad valorem assessments.
