

Health and Human Services Investment Review Committee – Member Qualifications

Philanthropic/Foundation Representative

An individual with professional experience in philanthropy, foundation administration, grantmaking, or charitable investment. This member should demonstrate familiarity with evaluating nonprofit programs, measuring community impact, and aligning funding decisions with strategic priorities. Experience serving on foundation boards, grants committees, or in senior leadership roles within philanthropic organizations is preferred.

Financial Expert

An individual with professional expertise in finance, accounting, budgeting, or fiscal analysis. This member should be capable of reviewing program budgets and financial narratives to assess cost reasonableness, sustainability, and alignment with proposed services. Credentials may include CPA, CFA, finance director experience, or comparable professional background. This role is limited to feasibility review and does not include auditing or financial oversight authority.

Housing Specialist

A professional with demonstrated experience in affordable housing, homelessness prevention, housing stability, or related housing services affecting adult populations. This may include experience in housing development, housing policy, supportive housing, continuum of care programs, or housing-focused nonprofit leadership. The member should have knowledge of local housing challenges and systems impacting adult residents.

Medical or Public Health Representative

An individual with education or professional experience in public health, population health, healthcare administration, or community health systems. This member should possess knowledge of adult health trends, behavioral health systems, health equity, or prevention strategies relevant to adult human services. Experience may include public health agencies, healthcare systems, research institutions, or policy-focused roles.

Licensed Healthcare Provider

A currently or formerly licensed healthcare professional, such as a physician, nurse, behavioral health clinician, or allied health professional, with experience providing direct clinical or therapeutic services to adult populations. The member should bring practical insight into service delivery, client needs, and clinical feasibility while maintaining independence from applicant organizations.

Senior Services Advocate

An individual with experience advocating for, planning, or delivering services to older adults. This may include work in aging services, elder advocacy, senior-focused nonprofit

organizations, caregiver support programs, or advisory roles related to aging policy. The member should demonstrate an understanding of the unique needs of seniors within the adult human services continuum.

Certified Contract Manager or Higher Education Representative

An individual with professional experience in contract management, procurement, compliance, higher education administration, or program evaluation. Examples include Certified Contract Managers (CCM), procurement professionals, grants administrators, or faculty/administrators from postsecondary institutions. This member should contribute expertise in contract structure, accountability, performance measurement, or workforce development systems.
