Mental Health/Substance Abusers: Redirects individuals to the appropriate community resource(s).

Congestive Heart Failure Chronic Respiratory Conditions: Ensures proper medication compliance, nutrition, and education on disease management.

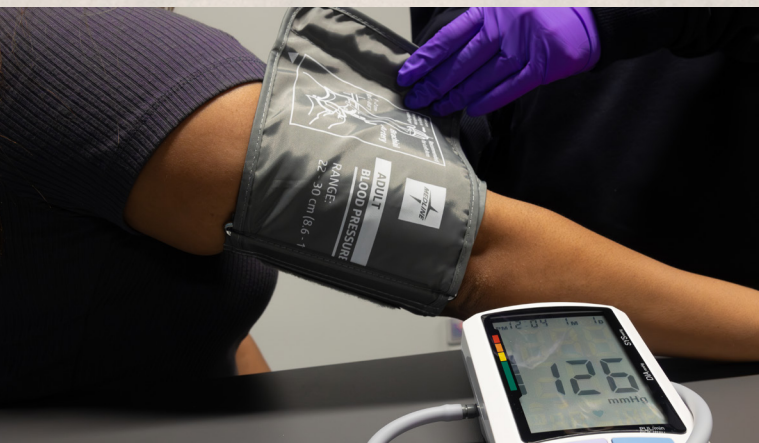
